# **Systems Engineering Professional Certification**

The International Council on Systems Engineering (INCOSE) established a multi-level Professional SEP Certification Program to provide a formal method for recognizing the knowledge and experience of systems engineers, regardless of where they may be in their career. This professional certification is gaining significance in the industry, so that any systems engineer should give serious thought to obtaining such professional recognition. The local San Diego Chapter of INCOSE is considering the idea of hosting study groups to help our members pass the test for the SEP certification.
